Selina Sheth, born 1972 in India, is an author, journalist, screenwriter and creative consultant working in fiction and non-fiction formats across Indian and international markets.

A post-graduate from the Indian Institute of Mass Communication, New Delhi, Selina's work has featured on **BBC World, Asia Business News India, MTV Asia News, Sony Entertainment Television, Star Television India, Zee Television Network, Walt Disney India, Doordarshan**, the Toronto-based **Kahani Film Company** and **HBO Asia**; her portfolio also includes stints as Content Commissioning Editor with **Sony Entertainment**, as story consultant on the 2008 Hindi-language feature film **Dil Kabaddi** (directed by Anil Senior/starring Irrfan Khan) and as the writer/director of **The Red Thread Zens** (a 1997 documentary on author-poet Amrita Pritam). More recently, she has worked on a limited web-series adaptation of Manju Kapur's classic novel **Difficult Daughters**.
